COUSINS REUNION

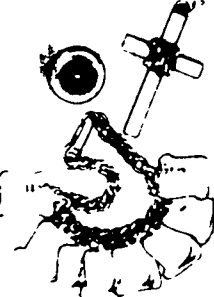

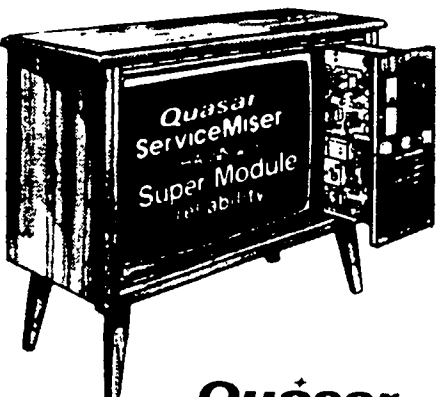

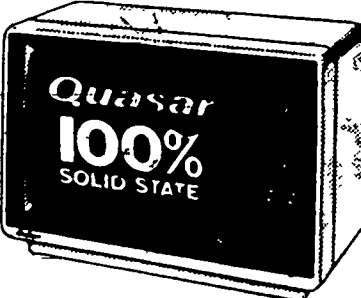
